<p><u>Legal Title</u> Department of Pesticide Regulation Fund</p>	
<p><u>Legal Citation/Authority</u> Governor's Reorganization Plan No. 1 of 1991, Sections 28-40 Food and Agriculture Code sections 13127.6, 13170, and 29082</p>

<p><u>Purpose</u> The Reorganization Plan created the fund and required it be used for the enforcement of pesticide laws. The same section transferred specified money in the Department of Food and Agriculture Fund to the Department of Pesticide Regulation Fund. Pesticide registration, worker health and safety, and medical toxicology, information systems, pesticide product quality, license and test certification, enforcement, and pesticide management and analysis. Food and Agriculture Code Section 13127.6, 13170, and 29082 further expanded sources of revenue for the fund.</p>	
<p><u>Administering Agency/Organization Code</u> Department of Pesticide Regulation/Org 3930</p>	
<p><u>Major Revenue Source</u> Major sources of revenue for this fund include regulatory taxes, licenses and permits, document sales, surplus money investments, penalty assessments, and civil and criminal violation assessments. The largest single source of revenue is mill tax assessments per dollar of pesticide sold.</p>	
<p><u>Disposition of Fund (upon abolishment)</u> Pursuant to Government Code section 16346, in absence of language that identifies a successor fund, any balance remaining in this fund upon abolishment, shall be transferred to the General Fund.</p>	
<p><u>Appropriation Authority</u> Section 13170 of the Food and Agriculture Code provides that the account is to be used, upon appropriation by the Legislature.</p>	
<p><u>State Appropriations Limit</u> Excluded - Revenues in this fund are not proceeds of taxes, however, when transferred, may become proceeds of taxes. These revenues are used to regulate the activities engaged in by the payers.</p>
