<b><u>Purpose</u></b> Allocation of \$850 million available for the following: 1) For infill incentive grants for capital outlay related to infill housing development and other related infill development including, but not limited to, all of the following: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• No more than two hundred million dollars (200,000,000) for park creation, development, or rehabilitation to encourage infill development.</li> <li>• Water, sewer, or other public infrastructure costs associated with infill development.</li> <li>• Transportation improvements related to infill development projects.</li> <li>• Traffic mitigation.</li> </ul> 2) For brownfield cleanup that promotes infill housing development and other related infill development consistent with regional and local plans.		
<b><u>Administering Agency/Organization Code</u></b> Department of Housing and Community Development/Org 2240		
<b><u>Major Revenue Source</u></b> Proceeds of Bonds		
<b><u>Disposition of Fund (upon abolishment)</u></b> Pursuant to Government Code section 16346, in the absence of language that identifies a successor fund, any balance remaining in this fund upon abolishment shall be transferred to the General Fund.		
<b><u>Appropriation Authority</u></b> Upon appropriation by the Legislature		
<b><u>State Appropriations Limit</u></b> <b>Always Excluded</b> – Revenues in this fund are not proceeds of taxes and even after transfer, will never become proceeds of taxes because the major revenue source is derived from a Bond Fund.
