<b><u>Legal Title</u></b> Childhood Lead Poisoning Prevention Fund		
<b><u>Legal Citation/Authority</u></b> Chapter 415, Statutes of 1995 (SB 1360) Health and Safety Code section 105310		
<b><u>Fund Classification</u></b> <b><u>GAAP Basis</u></b> Governmental/Special Revenue Funds	<b><u>Fund Classification</u></b> <b><u>Legal Basis</u></b> Governmental/Other Governmental Cost Funds	
<b><u>Purpose</u></b> This fund will be used to deposit fees collected by the Board of Equalization from companies involved in manufacture of or selling of lead based products or products containing lead. The funds less administrative and collection fees will then be transferred to this fund for support of the Childhood Lead Poisoning Prevention Program.		
<b><u>Administering Agency/Organization Code</u></b> Department of Public Health/Org 4265		
<b><u>Major Revenue Source</u></b> Fees collected from manufacturers and persons engaged in the manufacture or sale of lead containing products.  Interest earned on funds deposited.		
<b><u>Disposition of Fund (upon abolishment)</u></b> Pursuant to Government Code section 16346, absent language that identifies a successor fund, any balance remaining in this fund upon abolishment, shall be transferred to the General Fund.		
<b><u>Appropriation Authority</u></b> Upon appropriation by the Legislature.		
<b><u>State Appropriations Limit</u></b> <b>Excluded-</b> Revenues in this fund are not proceeds of taxes, however, when transferred, may become proceeds of taxes. These revenues are used to regulate the activities engaged in by the payers.		
<b><u>Comments/Historical Information</u></b> Chapter 799, Statutes of 1991 created this fund under Health and Safety Code section 372.7. Chapter 415, Statutes of 1995 repealed the Health and Safety Code section 372.7 and moved it to Health and Safety Code section 105310. Original Administrative Organization Code 4260 was changed to 4265 due to the Department of Health Services splitting into two departments effective July 2007 according to Chapter 241, Statutes of 2007 (SB162).
