<b><u>Legal Title</u></b> Local Project Account for Non-transient Spending, California Unitary Fund		
<b><u>Legal Citation/Authority</u></b> Chapter 660, Statutes of 1986 Government Code section 16429.30		
<b><u>Fund Classification</u></b> <b><u>GAAP Basis</u></b> Governmental/Special Revenue Funds	<b><u>Fund Classification</u></b> <b><u>Legal Basis</u></b> Governmental/Other Governmental Cost Funds	
<b><u>Purpose</u></b> The moneys in this fund shall be used exclusively for infrastructure financing and economic development, as specified.		
<b><u>Administering Agency/Org Code</u></b> Department of Commerce/Org 8570, Department of Food and Agriculture, and the World Trade Commission.		
<b><u>Major Sources of Revenue</u></b> An unspecified amount of money deposited pursuant to any provisions of the law.		
<b><u>Disposition of Fund (upon abolishment)</u></b> Pursuant to Government Code section 16346, absent language that identifies a successor fund, any balance remaining in this fund upon abolishment shall be transferred to the General Fund.		
<b><u>Appropriation Authority</u></b> Section 16429.40 of the Government Code provides that the moneys in the California Unitary Fund are available upon appropriation by the Legislature.		
<b><u>State Appropriations Limit</u></b> <b>Included</b> - Revenues in this fund are proceeds of taxes which are included as SAL revenues. The major revenue source for this fund does not have a logical, direct relationship between the use or purposes and the payers from whom it was collected.		
<b><u>Comments/Historical Information</u></b> Pursuant to Government Code Section 13306(b), this fund is being administratively abolished effective January 1, 2001.
