<b><u>Legal Title</u></b> Exposition Park Improvement Fund		
<b><u>Legal Citation/Authority</u></b> Chapter 300, Statutes of 1997 (AB 1586) Food and Agriculture Code section 4106

<b><u>Purpose</u></b> For improvements to Exposition Park, including, but not limited to, maintenance of existing parking and museum facilities, replacement of museum equipment, supplies and wages expended to generate revenues from rental of museum facilities, development of new parking facilities, and acquisition of land within or adjacent to Exposition Park.		
<b><u>Administering Agency/Organization Code</u></b> California Science Center/Org 3100		
<b><u>Major Revenue Source</u></b> Revenues received each year by the California Science Center from parking, rental of museum facilities, ground leases, and other business activities and private donations.		
<b><u>Disposition of Fund (upon abolishment)</u></b> Pursuant to Government Code section 16346, absent language that identifies a successor fund, any balance remaining in this fund upon abolishment shall be transferred to the General Fund.		
<b><u>Appropriation Authority</u></b> Food and Agricultural Code section 4106 provides that the moneys in the fund may be used, upon appropriation by the Legislature and provides that private contributions and funds from governmental agencies other than state agencies shall be available for expenditure without regard to fiscal year for implementation of the California Science Center Exposition Park Master Plan.		
<b><u>State Appropriations Limit</u></b> Always Excluded - Revenues in this fund are not proceeds of taxes and even after transfer, will never become proceeds of taxes because the major revenue source is derived from state funds from property leases.		
<b><u>Comments/Historical Information</u></b> Chapter 1171, Statutes of 1988 created this fund. Chapter 841, Statutes of 1996 changed the administering agency from California Museum of Science and Industry to the California Science Center. Pursuant to the Governor's Reorganization Plan 2, the Administering Agency's Organization Code changed from Org 1100 to Org 3100, effective July 1, 2013.
