<b><u>Purpose</u></b> Created to provide or plan for the restoration, preservation, and display of the historic documents of the state. By that legislation, the fund was created for the deposit of donations, grants, and gifts to assist it in carrying out these purposes.		
<b><u>Administering Agency/Organization Code</u></b> California Heritage Preservation Commission		
<b><u>Major Revenue Source</u></b> Funds, donations, gifts and grants from any sources.		
<b><u>Disposition of Fund (upon abolishment)</u></b> Expenditures for purposes of restoration, preservation, and display of historic documents.		
<b><u>Appropriation Authority</u></b> Section 4 of Chapter 1938, Statutes of 1963 provides the moneys in the fund may be expended as appropriated by the Legislature.		
<b><u>State Appropriations Limit</u></b> <b>Always Excluded</b> – Revenues in this fund are not proceeds of taxes and even after transfer, will never become proceeds of taxes because the major revenue source is derived from a Trust and Agency Fund (Non-Federal).		
<b><u>Comments/Historical Information</u></b> Administratively abolished per Government Code section 13306(b), effective 2/6/2012.
