<b><u>Purpose</u></b> Money in this account will be transferred to subaccounts for the purposes specified in Water Code Chapter 5, Article 1, sections 79033 to 79069.12.		
<b><u>Administering Agency/Organization Code</u></b> Department of Water Resources/Org 3860		
<b><u>Major Revenue Source</u></b> Money transferred from the Safe Drinking Water, Clean Water, Watershed Protection, and Flood Protection Bond Fund (Fund 6001)		
<b><u>Disposition of Fund (upon abolishment)</u></b> Pursuant to Government Code section 16346, absent language that identifies a successor fund, any balance remaining in this fund upon abolishment shall be transferred to the General Fund.		
<b><u>Appropriation Authority</u></b> Money deposited to this fund will be transferred to the subaccounts and appropriated as specified by the legislation.		
<b><u>State Appropriations Limit</u></b> <b>Always Excluded</b> – The major revenue source is transferred from another fund which is already been counted or will be counted in an always excluded fund, Safe Drinking Water, Clean Water, Watershed Protection, and Flood Protection Bond Fund (Fund 6001), and should not be double counted; as well as, this fund is also derived from a Bond Fund.		
<b><u>Comments/Historical Information</u></b> This fund was established by the passage of Proposition 13 on the March 2000 ballot.
