Subject: Recognized Obligation Payment Schedule

Pursuant to Health and Safety Code (HSC) section 34177 (m), the City of Eureka Successor Agency (Agency) submitted a Recognized Obligation Payment Schedule (ROPS 15-16A) to the California Department of Finance (Finance) on March 3, 2015 for the period of July 1 through December 31, 2015. Finance has completed its review of your ROPS 15-16A, which may have included obtaining clarification for various items.

Based on a sample of line items reviewed and application of the law, Finance made the following determinations:

- The total outstanding principal balances for Item Nos. 53, 54, and 56 are overstated. Based on the documentation provided, Finance updated the outstanding loan balances to include repayments made on previous ROPS. Therefore, the outstanding balances as of ROPS 15-16A period should be as follows:
 - Item No. 53 – Loan No. 55 Phase I-Third and C Street Reconstruction. The Agency was approved and funded for \$17,724 of loan repayment during ROPS 14-15B period. Finance has recalculated the total loan outstanding to be approximately \$10,819, and has therefore reduced the outstanding loan balance reported on the Agency's ROPS Detail Form by \$17,681. Additionally, we are approving loan repayments of \$2,850 on the current ROPS. Therefore, the outstanding loan balance on the subsequent ROPS should also be updated to reflect the loan repayment made during the ROPS 15-16A period
 - Item No. 54 – Loan No. 56 Phase II-Third and C Street Reconstruction. The Agency was approved and funded for \$29,956 of loan repayment during ROPS 14-15B period. Finance has recalculated the total loan outstanding to be approximately \$3,819, and has therefore reduced the outstanding loan balance reported on the Agency's ROPS Detail Form by \$29,981. Additionally, we are approving loan repayments of \$3,380 on the current ROPS. Therefore, the outstanding loan balance on the subsequent ROPS should also be updated to reflect the loan repayment made during the ROPS 15-16A period

- Item No. 56 – Loan No. 193 Inner Channel Docks-Boardwalk Revitalization. The Agency was approved and funded for \$120,966 of loan repayment during ROPS 14-15B period. Finance has recalculated the total loan outstanding to be approximately \$543,316, and has therefore reduced the outstanding loan balance reported on the Agency's ROPS Detail Form by \$119,684. Additionally, we are approving loan repayments of \$66,300 on the current ROPS. Therefore, the outstanding loan balance on the subsequent ROPS should also be updated to reflect the loan repayment made during the ROPS 15-16A period

During our review, which may have included obtaining financial records, Finance determined the Agency possesses funds that should be used prior to requesting Redevelopment Property Tax Trust Fund (RPTTF). Pursuant to HSC section 34177 (l) (1) (E), RPTTF may be used as a funding source, but only to the extent no other funding source is available or when payment from property tax revenues is required by an enforceable obligation. The Agency provided financial records that displayed available Reserve Balances of \$215,465.

Therefore, with the Agency's concurrence, the funding source for the following item has been reclassified to Reserve Balances in the amount specified below:

- Item No. 1 – 2003 EPFA Bonds in the amount of \$215,465. The Agency requests \$826,516 of RPTTF; however, Finance is reclassifying \$215,465 to Reserve Balances. This item is an enforceable obligation for the ROPS 15-16A period. However, the obligation does not require payment from property tax revenues and the Agency has \$215,465 in available Reserve Balances. Therefore, Finance is approving RPTTF in the amount of \$611,051 and the use of Reserve Balances in the amount of \$215,465, totaling \$826,516.

Pursuant to HSC section 34186 (a), successor agencies were required to report on the ROPS 15-16A form the estimated obligations and actual payments (prior period adjustments) associated with the July through December 2014 period. HSC section 34186 (a) also specifies prior period adjustments self-reported by successor agencies are subject to audit by the county auditor-controller (CAC) and the State Controller. Proposed CAC adjustments were not received in time for inclusion in this letter; therefore, the amount of RPTTF approved in the table below only reflects the prior period adjustment self-reported by the Agency.

Except for the item that has been reclassified, Finance is not objecting to the remaining items listed on your ROPS 15-16A. If you disagree with the determination with respect to any items on your ROPS 15-16A, you may request a Meet and Confer within five business days of the date of this letter. Absent a Meet and Confer, this is Finance's final determination related to the enforceable obligations reported on your ROPS for July 1 through December 31, 2015. This determination only applies to items where funding was requested for the six-month period. Finance's determination is effective for this time period only and should not be conclusively relied upon for future periods. All items listed on a future ROPS are subject to a subsequent review and may be denied even if it was or was not denied on this ROPS or a preceding ROPS. The only exception is for those items that have received a Final and Conclusive determination from Finance pursuant to HSC section 34177.5 (i). Finance's review of items that have received a Final and Conclusive determination is limited to confirming the scheduled payments as required by the obligation.

The amount available from the RPTTF is the same as the amount of property tax increment that was available prior to the enactment of ABx1 26 and AB 1484. This amount is not and never was an unlimited funding source. Therefore, as a practical matter, the ability to fund the items on the ROPS with property tax is limited to the amount of funding available to the agency in the RPTTF.

Pursuant to HSC section 34177 (a) (3), only those payments listed on an approved ROPS may be made by the successor agency from the funds specified in the ROPS. However, if the Agency needs to make payments for approved obligations from another funding source, HSC section 34177 (a) (4) requires the Agency to first obtain oversight board approval.

To the extent proceeds from bonds issued after December 31, 2010 exist and are not encumbered by an enforceable obligation pursuant to HSC section 34171 (d),

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HSC section 34191.4 (c) (2) (B) requires these proceeds be used to defease the bonds or to purchase those same outstanding bonds on the open market for cancellation.
