<p><u>Legal Title</u> California Health Data and Planning Fund</p>	
<p><u>Legal Citation/Authority</u> Chapter 32, Statutes of 2011 Health and Safety Code sections 127125-127300 Health and Safety Code section 127280(g) establishes the California Health Data and Planning Fund</p>	
<p><u>Fund Classification</u> <u>GAAP Basis</u> Governmental/Special Revenue Funds</p>	<p><u>Fund Classification</u> <u>Legal Basis</u> Governmental/Other Governmental Cost Funds</p>
<p><u>Purpose</u> For the purpose of receiving and expending special health facility fee revenues. Fees collected but not required to meet current year appropriations shall remain in the Fund and shall be available in succeeding years when appropriated by the Legislature.</p>	
<p><u>Administering Agency/Organization Code</u> Office of Statewide Health Planning and Development/Org 4140</p>	
<p><u>Major Revenue Source</u> Special health facility fees.</p>	
<p><u>Disposition of Fund (upon abolishment)</u> Pursuant to Government Code 16346, in the absence of language that identifies a successor fund, any balance remaining in this fund upon abolishment, shall be transferred to the General Fund.</p>	
<p><u>Appropriation Authority</u> Health and Safety Code section 127280(h) requires appropriations to be included in the Budget Act.</p>	
<p><u>State Appropriations Limit</u> Excluded - Revenues in this fund are not proceeds of taxes, however, when transferred, may become proceeds of taxes. These revenues are used to regulate the activities engaged in by the payers.</p>	
<p><u>Comments/Historical Information</u> This fund was originally created in Health and Safety Code section 439 which was subsequently repealed by Chapter 415, Statutes of 1995 (SB 1360), effective January 1, 1996. Chapter 735, Statues of 1998 recreated this fund operative January 1, 2002. There are two Health and Safety Code sections 127280. The first of two becomes inoperative January 1, 2012 and the second of two becomes operative January 1, 2012.</p>
