<b><u>Purpose</u></b> A depository for original and renewal fees for fireworks licenses.		
<b><u>Administering Agency/Organization Code</u></b> Office of the State Fire Marshal/Org 1710		
<b><u>Major Revenue Source</u></b> Original and annual renewal fees for fireworks licenses.		
<b><u>Disposition of Fund (upon abolishment)</u></b> Any balance remaining in this fund shall be transferred to the State Fire Marshal Licensing and Certification Fund (0102).		
<b><u>Appropriation Authority</u></b> Section 12635 of the Health and Safety Code provides that the moneys in the fund shall be available when appropriated by the Legislature.		
<b><u>State Appropriations Limit</u></b> Excluded - Revenues in this fund are not proceeds of taxes, however, when transferred, may become proceeds of taxes. These revenues are used to regulate the activities engaged in by the payers.		
<b><u>Comments/Historical Information</u></b> Chapter 306, Statutes of 1992 (AB 2998) deleted the California Fireworks Licensing Fund and changed it to the State Fire Marshal Licensing and Certification Fund (0102).
