<b><u>Purpose</u></b> To fund projects or programs concerning the water resources of the state that will contribute significant environmental benefits.		
<b><u>Administering Agency/Organization Code</u></b> Department of Water Resources/Org 3860		
<b><u>Major Revenue Source</u></b> Transfers from the California Water Fund (Fund 0144), annual appropriations, and investment income in accordance with Water Code section 12929.10 through 12929.15.		
<b><u>Disposition of Fund (upon abolishment)</u></b> Pursuant to Government Code section 16346, absent language that identifies a successor fund, any balance remaining in this fund upon abolishment, shall be transferred to the General Fund.		
<b><u>Appropriation Authority</u></b> Upon appropriation by the Legislature.		
<b><u>State Appropriations Limit</u></b> Always Excluded - The major revenue source is transferred from another fund which has already been counted in an always excluded fund, the California Water Fund, and should not be double counted.		
<b><u>Comments/Historical Information</u></b> Chapter 715, Statutes of 1989 enacted the Environmental Water Act of 1989 which created two Programs, the Water Quality Program and the Environmental Water Program. See Water Code section 12570 through 12949.6 for Water Development Projects.
