<b><u>Purpose</u></b> This fund was created to deposit the fees that cities and counties are required to collect from each applicant for a building permit, for seismic hazards mapping and for the strong-motion instrumentation program.		
<b><u>Administering Agency/Organization Code</u></b> Department of Conservation/Org 3480		
<b><u>Major Revenue Source</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Building permit fees</li> <li>• Other sources (Section 2709.1(c))</li> </ul>		
<b><u>Disposition of Fund (upon abolishment)</u></b> Pursuant to Government Code 16346, absent language that identifies a successor fund, any balance remaining in this fund upon abolishment shall be transferred to the General Fund.		
<b><u>Appropriation Authority</u></b> The money in this fund is available upon appropriation by the Legislature.		
<b><u>State Appropriations Limit</u></b> <b>Excluded</b> – Revenues in this fund are not proceeds of taxes, however, when transferred, may become proceeds of taxes. These revenues have a logical, direct relationship with the use or purposes for which they are used.		
<b><u>Comments/Historical Information</u></b> Chapter 240, Statutes of 2003 (AB 1747), renamed this fund from the Seismic Hazards Identification Fund to the Strong-Motion Instrumentation and Seismic Hazards Mapping Fund, effective July 1, 2004.
