<u>Purpose</u> The California State Police Fund was created as a depository for money transferred by the counties for 50% of all fines and forfeitures collected during the preceding month upon conviction of any person or upon the forfeiture of bail from any person arrested or notified by a peace officer of the California State Police Division.		
<u>Administering Agency/Organization Code</u> Department of General Services/Org 1760		
<u>Major Revenue Source</u> Fines and forfeitures transferred from counties from convictions of person arrested or from persons forfeiting bail who were arrested or notified by a peace officer of the California State Police.		
<u>Disposition of Funds (upon abolishment)</u> Absent any other language, any balance remaining in this fund as of November 1, 1999 will be transferred to the General Fund.		
<u>Appropriation Authority</u> Section 14613.05 of the Government Code provides that the money is available when appropriated by the Legislature.		
<u>State Appropriations Limit</u> Always Excluded.		
<u>Comments/Historical Information</u> Chapter 305, Statutes of 1996 transferred the program to the California Highway Patrol as of the 1995-96 fiscal year. However, legislation did not abolish the fund nor provide for the transfer of monies to the Highway Patrol. Therefore, this fund was administratively abolished effective November 1, 1999. The balance remaining in the fund will be transferred to the General Fund. (Note: this fund was abolished from the State Controller's records and the funds transferred in August, 1998)
