<b><u>Legal Title</u></b> Small Communities Grant Subaccount		
<b><u>Legal Citation/Authority</u></b> Chapter 725, Statutes of 1999 and Chapter 135, Statutes of 1996 Water Code sections 78611 and 79122(b)		
<b><u>Fund Classification</u></b> <b><u>GAAP Basis</u></b> Governmental/Special Revenue Funds	<b><u>Fund Classification</u></b> <b><u>Legal Basis</u></b> Nongovernmental/Bond Funds	
<b><u>Purpose</u></b> This act authorizes the issue of general obligation bonds for the purposes of financing prescribed water programs. The purpose of the money deposited in this subaccount is to provide grants to small communities for construction of eligible treatment works.		
<b><u>Administering Agency/Organization Code</u></b> State Water Resources Control Board/Org 3940		
<b><u>Major Revenue Source</u></b> Transfer of bond proceeds from the Clean Water and Water Recycling Account.		
<b><u>Disposition of Fund (upon abolishment)</u></b> Pursuant to Government Code 16346, absent language that identifies a successor fund, any balance remaining in this fund upon abolishment shall be transferred to the General Fund.		
<b><u>Appropriation Authority</u></b> Continuously appropriated.		
<b><u>State Appropriations Limit</u></b> <b>Always Excluded</b> — The major revenue source is transferred from another fund which has already in an always excluded fund, Clean Water and Water Recycling Account (0416), and should not be double counted; as well as, this fund is derived from a Bond Fund.		
<b><u>Comments/Historical Information</u></b> Proposition 204, the Safe, Clean, Reliable Water Supply Act, in the November 5, 1996 election originally established the fund and Proposition 13 of the March 7, 2000 election added additional bond sales. No more than 3% of the money transferred may be used for administrative costs.
