<u>Purpose</u> Funds are used to cover the costs of neurological examinations required as a condition of licensure for professional athletes or contestants in accordance with Business and Professions Code section 18700 through 18748.		
<u>Administering Agency/Organization Code</u> Department of Consumer Affairs – Bureaus, Programs, Divisions/Org 1111		
<u>Major Revenue Source</u> Assessments on promoters of professional matches, managers, and professional athletes or other licensed contestants pursuant.		
<u>Disposition of Fund (upon abolishment)</u> Pursuant to Government Code section 16346, in absence of language that identifies a successor fund, any balance remaining in this fund upon abolishment, shall be transferred to the General Fund.		
<u>Appropriation Authority</u> Upon appropriation by the Legislature		
<u>State Appropriations Limit</u> Excluded – Revenues in this fund are not proceeds of taxes, however, when transferred, may become proceeds of taxes. These revenues have a logical, direct relationship with the use and purposes for which they are used.		
<u>Comments/Historical Information</u> Chapter 1242, Statutes of 1985 created the Boxer's Neurological Examination Account in the General Fund under Business and Professions Code Section 18742.7 (c) as a depository for moneys received by the State Athletic Commission from assessments on promoters of professional boxing matches to cover the cost of neurological exams for boxers. Chapter 1057, Statutes of 1993 revised Business and Professions Code section 18711 to establish an abolishment date of January 1, 1994. Chapter 150, Statutes of 1994, reestablished this fund.		

Chapter 465, Statutes of 2006, re-established the Commission under the Department of Consumer Affairs regulatory boards.

Effective October 2015, administering agency change from the Department of Consumer Affairs – Regulatory Boards/Org 1110 to the current organization.
