<u>Purpose</u> This fund is used as a depository of toll revenues collected after the bonds issued to construct the bridge have been retired. Moneys in the fund are to be used for bridge operation, maintenance, rehabilitation, and improvement, and improving the approaches to the bridge. In addition, funds may also be used to fund a study conducted by the Department of Transportation improvements and programs to alleviate bridge-related transportation problems.		
<u>Administering Agency/Organization Code</u> Department of Transportation/Org Code 2660		
<u>Major Revenue Source</u> Toll Revenues.		
<u>Disposition of Fund (Upon Abolishment)</u> Pursuant to Government Code 16346, absent language that identifies a successor fund, any balance remaining in this fund upon abolishment shall be transferred to the General Fund.		
<u>Appropriation Authority</u> Section 30796.7 of the Streets and Highways Code.		
<u>State Appropriations Limit</u> <i>Always Excluded</i> --Revenues in this fund are not proceeds of taxes and even after transfer, will never become proceeds of taxes because the major revenue source is of toll bridge revenues.		
<u>Comments/Historical Information</u> Administrative Org. changed from 2600 to 2660. The San Diego-Coronado Toll Revenue Fund was created administratively by the Department of Finance, pursuant to Section 13306 of the Government Code. Fund abolished per Government Code section 13306(b).
