<b><u>Legal Title</u></b> Domestic Violence Training and Education Fund

<b><u>Purpose</u></b> To support statewide training and education programs to increase public awareness of domestic violence and to improve the scope and quality of services provided to the victims of domestic violence.		
<b><u>Administering Agency/ Organization Code</u></b> Department of Public Health/Org Code 4265		
<b><u>Major Revenue Source</u></b> Fines and penalties received from defendants convicted of domestic violence crimes.		
<b><u>Disposition of Funds (upon abolishment)</u></b> Pursuant to Government Code section 16346, absent language that identifies a successor fund, any balance remaining in this fund upon abolishment, shall be transferred to the General Fund.		
<b><u>Appropriation Authority</u></b> This fund is available upon appropriation by the Legislature		
<b><u>State Appropriations Limit</u></b> <b>Always Excluded</b> - Revenues in this fund are not proceeds of taxes and even after transfer, will never become proceeds of taxes because the major revenue source is derived from fines and penalties.		
<b><u>Comments/Historical Information</u></b> Chapter 431, Statutes of 2003 added this fund.  This fund is one of two that replace fund 0253 (Domestic Violence Fund) that is abolished effective January 1, 1999. See also fund 0641 (Domestic Violence Restraining Order Reimbursement Fund). Original Administrative Organization Code 4260 was changed to 4265 due to the Department of Health Services splitting into two departments effective July 2007 according to Chapter 241, Statutes of 2006 SB162.
