<b><u>Legal Title</u></b> California State University Special Projects Fund

<b><u>Purpose</u></b> The fund was created for the deposit of moneys accepted by the trustees from any source to be used for research, workshops, conferences, institutes, and special projects.		
<b><u>Administering Agency/Organization Code</u></b> Trustees of the California State University/Org 6610		
<b><u>Major Revenue Sources</u></b> Grants, revenues, and funds from any source for the purposes of this fund.		
<b><u>Disposition of Fund (upon abolishment)</u></b> Pursuant to Government Code 16346, in the absence of language that identifies a successor fund, any balance remaining in this fund upon abolishment, shall be transferred to the General Fund.		
<b><u>Appropriation Authority</u></b> Section 89725 of the Education Code provides that the fund is appropriated without regard to fiscal years "for the operation, support, and development of research, workshops, conferences, institutes, and special projects in the California State University.		
<b><u>State Appropriations Limit</u></b> <b>Always Excluded</b> – Revenues in this fund are not proceeds of taxes and even after transfer, will never become proceeds of taxes because the major revenue source is derived from a Trust and Agency Fund (Non-Federal).		
<b><u>Comments/Historical Information</u></b> Chapter 1278, Statutes of 1971 created the State College Special Project Fund. Chapter 44, Statutes of 1974 changed the title of the fund to the California State University and Colleges Special Projects Fund. Chapter 143, Statutes of 1983 changed the title of the fund to the California State University Special Projects Fund.
