<u>Purpose</u> For restoration, enhancement, and nourishment of public beaches.		
<u>Administering Agency/Org Code</u> Department of Parks and Recreation/Org 3790		
<u>Revenue Source</u> Transfers from the General Fund or Harbors and Watercraft Revolving Fund.		
<u>Disposition of Funds (upon abolishment)</u> Pursuant to Government Code section 16346, absent language that identifies a successor fund, any balance remaining in this fund upon abolishment shall be transferred to the General Fund less any portion of the annual transfer from the Harbors and Watercraft Revolving Fund (which is a Nongovernmental/Public Service Enterprise Fund).		
<u>Appropriation Authority</u> Upon appropriation in the annual Budget Act.		
<u>State Appropriations Limit</u> Always Excluded – The major revenue source is transferred from another fund which has already been counted or will be counted in an included fund, the General Fund (0001) or Harbors and Watercraft Revolving Fund (0516), and should not be double counted.		
<u>Comments/Historical Information</u> 60% of the appropriation is for projects in San Luis Obispo County and southward and 40% is for projects in Monterey County and northward. Pursuant to the Governor’s Reorganization Plan 2, the Administering Agency and Organization Code changed from Department of Boating and Waterways/Org 3680 to Department of Parks and Recreation/Org 3790, effective July 1, 2013.
