<b><u>Purpose</u></b> To cover the costs of placing persons in and providing drug treatment programs for vocational training, family counseling, literacy training, as well as other cost reimbursements as specified in Health and Safety Code section 11999.6.		
<b><u>Administering Agency/Organization Code</u></b> Department of Health Care Services/Org 4260		
<b><u>Major Revenue Source</u></b> General fund transfer of \$60,000,000 for the 2000-01 fiscal year and \$120,000,000 annually for each subsequent year concluding with the 2005-06 fiscal year pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 11999.5.		
<b><u>Disposition of Fund (upon abolishment)</u></b> Pursuant to Government Code section 16346, absent language that identifies a successor fund, any balance remaining in this fund upon abolishment shall be transferred to the General Fund.		
<b><u>Appropriation Authority</u></b> This fund is continuously appropriated.		
<b><u>State Appropriations Limit</u></b> <b>Always Excluded</b> – The major revenue source is transferred from another fund which has already been counted in an included fund, the General Fund (0001), and should not be double counted.		
<b><u>Comments/Historical Information</u></b> Proposition 36 was adopted by voters at the November 7, 2000 general election, effective July 1, 2001. Per the State Controller’s Office (SCO) there will be a 39-day certification period and annual transfers will be made by the SCO on the 1 <sup>st</sup> working day in July. An Executive Order will not be required to make the transfers. Chapter 22, Statutes of 2013 (AB 75) Section 66 changed the Administering Agency from the Department of Alcohol and Drug Programs/Org 4200 to Department of Health Care Services/Org 4260 effective June 27, 2013.
