<b><u>Purpose</u></b> To assist local land-use planning, and to avoid or reduce future flood risks and damages by making available Important Farmland Series maps and Interim Farmland maps.		
<b><u>Administering Agency/Organization Code</u></b> Department of Water Resources/Org 3860		
<b><u>Major Revenue Source</u></b> Money transferred from the Flood Protection Account (Fund 6002).		
<b><u>Disposition of Fund (upon abolishment)</u></b> Pursuant to Government Code 16346, absent language that identifies a successor fund, any balance remaining in this fund upon abolishment shall be transferred to the General Fund.		
<b><u>Appropriation Authority</u></b> Available upon appropriation by the Legislature.		
<b><u>State Appropriations Limit</u></b> <b>Always Excluded</b> – The major revenue source is transferred from another fund which is already been counted or will be counted in an always excluded fund, Flood Protection Account (Fund 6002), and should not be double counted; as well as, this fund is also derived from a Bond Fund.		
<b><u>Comments/Historical Information</u></b> This fund was established by the passage of Proposition 13 on the March 2000 ballot. Chapter 725, Statutes of 1999 includes legislative appropriation authority from this fund to the Department of Conservation for local land-use planning in conjunction with floodplain and flood hazard maps developed by the Department of Water Resources.
