<b><u>Purpose</u></b> To finance various existing housing programs, capital outlay related to infill development, brownfield cleanup that promotes infill development, and housing-related parks.		
<b><u>Administering Agency/Organization Code</u></b> Department of Housing and Community Development/Org 2240		
<b><u>Major Revenue Source</u></b> Proceeds of Bonds		
<b><u>Disposition of Fund (upon abolishment)</u></b> Allocated to other funds, including Affordable Housing Account, Regional Planning, Housing and Infill Incentive Account, Transit Oriented Development Account, and the Housing Urban-Suburban-and-Rural Parks Account pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 53545.		
<b><u>Appropriation Authority</u></b> Upon appropriation by the Legislature		
<b><u>State Appropriations Limit</u></b> <b>Always Excluded</b> – Revenues in this fund are not proceeds of taxes and even after transfer, will never become proceeds of taxes because the major revenue source is derived from a Bond Fund.		
<b><u>Comments/Historical Information</u></b> The Housing and Emergency Shelter Trust Fund Act of 2006 was approved by the voters at the November 7, 2006 general election as Proposition 1C.
