<b><u>Major Revenue Source</u></b> Donations, financial contributions from any public or private source, and revenue from concession operated at the State Capitol.		
<b><u>Disposition of Fund (upon abolishment)</u></b> Pursuant to Government Code section 16346, in the absence of language that identifies a successor fund, any balance remaining in this fund upon abolishment, shall be transferred to the General Fund.		
<b><u>Appropriation Authority</u></b> Amounts credited to Budget Act item 8270-001-8095 are appropriated in accordance with provisions provided under this item.		
<b><u>State Appropriations Limit</u></b> <b>Always Excluded</b> – Revenues in this fund are not proceeds of taxes and even after transfer, will never become proceeds of taxes because the major revenue source is derived from donations or financial contributions from public and private entities.
