<b><u>Purpose</u></b> Administrative costs of the State Historical Building Code Board.		
<b><u>Administering Agency/Organization Code</u></b> Department of General Services State Historical Building Code Board/ Org 1760		
<b><u>Major Revenue Source</u></b> Fees collected for the Boards appeal and interpretative functions. Fees collected for printed copies of the State Historical Building Code Board.		
<b><u>Disposition of Funds (upon abolishment)</u></b> Pursuant to Government Code 16346, absent language that identifies a successor fund, any balance remaining in this fund upon abolishment shall be transferred to the General Fund.		
<b><u>Appropriation Authority</u></b> Section 18960 of the Health and Safety Code provides that the money in the fund is continuously appropriated for the 84-85 fiscal year and thereafter shall be subject to annual appropriation in the Budget Act.		
<b><u>State Appropriations Limit</u></b> <b>Excluded</b> – Revenues in this fund are not proceeds of taxes, however, when transferred, may become proceeds of taxes. These revenues are used to provide direct services or products to the payers.		
<b><u>Comments/ Historical Information</u></b> Chapter 625, Statutes of 1990 amended Health and Safety Code section 18960 and removed the previously established abolishment date of 1/1/91. This fund is abolished per Government Code section 13306(b) effective October 22, 2010.
