<p><u>Legal Title</u> High Technology Theft Apprehension and Prosecution Program Trust Fund</p>	
<p><u>Legal Citation/Authority</u> Chapter 4, Statutes of 2009-2010 (SB 8XXX) Penal Code section 13848.4(a)</p>	
<p><u>Fund Classification</u> <u>GAAP Basis</u> Governmental/General Fund</p>	<p><u>Fund Classification</u> <u>Legal Basis</u> Non-Governmental/Trust and Agency Funds – Non-Federal</p>
<p><u>Purpose</u> The money in this fund will be expended to fund programs to enhance the capacity of local law enforcement, state police, and local prosecutors to deter, investigate, and prosecute high technology-related crimes.</p>	
<p><u>Administering Agency/Organization Code</u> California Emergency Management Agency/Org 0690</p>	
<p><u>Major Revenue Source</u> General Fund transfers, private donations, Federal grant funds</p>	
<p><u>Disposition of Fund (upon abolishment)</u> Pursuant to Government Code 16346, absent language that identifies a successor fund, any balance remaining in this fund upon abolishment shall be transferred to the General Fund.</p>	
<p><u>Appropriation Authority</u> This fund is available upon appropriation by the Legislature.</p>	
<p><u>State Appropriations Limit</u> Always Excluded - Revenues in this fund are not proceeds of taxes and even after transfer, will never become proceeds of taxes because the major revenue source is derived from a Trust and Agency Fund.</p>	
<p><u>Comments/Historical Information</u> Chapter 906, Statutes of 1997 (SB 438) created this fund.</p> <p>This fund was reclassified <i>from</i> a Trust and Agency – Federal fund <i>to</i> a Trust and Agency – Non Federal fund. OCJP/Org 8100 is abolished as of January 1, 2004, per Chapter 157, Statutes of 2003. OCJP's programs have been transferred to California Emergency Management Agency/Org 0690.</p> <p>Per Chapter 372, Statutes of 2008, the Office of Emergency Services and the Office of Homeland Security are merged to form the California Emergency Management Agency.</p>
