<u>Legal Title</u> AWOL Abatement Program Fund		
<u>Legal Citation/Authority</u> Chapter 563, Statutes of 1982 Military and Veterans Code section 467

<u>Purpose</u> All court-martial fines and penalties and all fines resulting from the imposition of disciplinary punishment is to be deposited into this fund. All moneys in the fund will be appropriated to the Military Department for purposes of programs to reduce absence without leave by members of the National Guard.		
<u>Administering Agency/Organization Code</u> Military Department/Org 8940		
<u>Major Sources</u> All fines collected under the amended Section 467, which is schedule for repeal as of July 1, 1984.		
<u>Disposition of Funds (upon abolishment)</u> All money in this fund is appropriated to the Military Department for the 1983-84 fiscal year for programs to reduce the rate of absence without leave among members of the California National Guard.		
<u>Appropriation Authority</u> Section 467 of the Military and Veterans Code, effective only until July 1, 1984, appropriates the money in the AWOL Abatement Program Fund to the Military Department for 1983-84 fiscal year programs to reduce absence without leave by members of the California National Guard.		
<u>State Appropriations Limit</u> Always Excluded - Revenues in this fund are not proceeds of taxes and even after transfer, will never become proceeds of taxes because the major revenue source is derived from fines.		
<u>Historical Comments</u> Chapter 563, Statutes of 1982 amended Section 467 of the Military and Veterans Code to create the AWOL Abatement Program Fund. It provides that the amended Section 467 referred to above remain in effect only to July 1, 1984, unless subsequent legislation deletes or extends that date. This chapter adds a new Section 467 that will become operative on July 1, 1984. The new section does not continue the AWOL Abatement Program Fund. Abolished by Chapter 659, Statutes of 1992, section 1, effective June 17, 2010.
