BILL SUMMARY: Sacramento-San Joaquin Multi-Hazard Task Force

This bill would provide that the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta Multi-Hazard Coordination Task Force shall cease to exist on the date on which it submits its final report to the Governor and Legislature. Current law provides for the report to be submitted prior to January 1, 2011.

FISCAL SUMMARY

According to staff of the California Emergency Management Agency (CalEMA), this bill would not increase costs to the state. State agencies were not provided additional resources to conduct this project and were required to absorb costs associated with the Task Force using existing resources.

COMMENTS

Existing law requires CalEMA to establish and lead, until January 1, 2011, the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta Multi-Hazard Coordination Task Force. The Task Force includes CalEMA, the Delta Protection Commission, the Department of Water Resources, and a single representative from each of the five delta counties.

The task force is required to do the following:

- Make recommendations to CalEMA relating to the creation of an interagency unified command system organizational framework.
- Coordinate the development of a draft emergency preparedness and response strategy for the delta region.
- Develop and conduct an all-hazard emergency response exercise in the delta.
- Submit a report with its strategy and recommendations to the Legislature and the Governor prior to January 1, 2011.
- Cease to exist on or before January 1, 2011.

State agencies were not provided additional resources to conduct this project and were required to absorb costs associated with the Task Force using existing resources. CalEMA indicates that the all-hazard emergency response exercise, i.e. Golden Guardian, is scheduled for May, 2011.

This bill would provide that the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta Multi-Hazard Coordination Task Force shall cease to exist on the date on which it submits its final report to the Governor and Legislature. Current law provides for the report to be submitted prior to January 1, 2011.
