BILL SUMMARY: Public Safety and Welfare

This bill would make mostly technical revisions to various public safety provisions. Most significantly, the bill would require a convicted as a sex offender from another jurisdiction to register within five working days of coming into California.

FISCAL SUMMARY

The Department of Justice (DOJ) reports no fiscal impact as a result of this bill. The Office of Inspector General (OIG) also reports no fiscal impact.

COMMENTS

This bill would revise provisions pertaining to: explosives permits, transient sex offender registration, DOJ reporting requirements regarding the Sex Offender Registration Act and criminal statistics, including custodial officers of Colusa County within the definition of peace officer, fingerprint roller employment applications, junk dealers, real estate fraud, sex offenders and their victims, an OIG certification program, and criminal offender and juvenile police records.
